SCAG's Future Communities Initiative – Why?



Communities in the SCAG Region:

- 70% have limited or minimal staff resources to analyze data
- 43% have no in-house GIS services
- 84% share data through direct communications

Regional Data Platform - Project Charter



- Most jurisdictions in the SCAG Region have not updated their General Plans comprehensively since 2004; about 30 jurisdictions are in process
- Newer General Plans are more innovative, and will help to implement <u>Connect SoCal</u>
 - 95% of jurisdictions undergoing an update have included policies that <u>encourage infill</u> <u>development</u>
 - 50% strategies that address complete communities and concentrating destinations
 - 60% include policies that <u>help facilitate transit oriented development</u>
 - 60% are including strategies that address <u>all</u> of these focus areas

Regional Data Platform - Project Charter



Goals:

- Facilitating a streamlined flow of up-to-date data between member agencies and SCAG
- Integrating regionally significant local data into SCAG's regional database as seamless regional datasets for use in forecasts and regional planning
- Providing all member agencies with access to expanded and standardized datasets, planning tools/dashboards, templates, and planning best practices to support general plan updates
- Promoting more dynamic and inclusive community engagement through web-based tools and capabilities
- Synchronizing local and regional planning activities, collectively resulting in smarter planning across Southern California
- Promote partnerships (e.g., with local governments, regional agencies, state and federal agencies, private firms, and universities and international organizations), to establish long term collaborative data sharing practices for regionally significant planning activities in Southern California, with the aim of promoting a common vision, shared goals, and mutual benefits

Standardizing and Integrating Data for Local Planning



SCAG Regional Data Platform Phase 1:

- Anticipated launch Fall 2021
- The Platform will provide an online tool for SCAG and local jurisdictions to access data necessary for local general plan development and general decision making by monitoring transportation, land development trends, housing and economic growth, and sustainability conditions
- It will also feature a data-driven collaboration hub for local jurisdictions to engage with stakeholders for individual projects, such as local and regional land use planning, active transportation planning, greenhouse gas reduction strategies, and development impact assessments
